Part of SKIT's mission is to award scholarships to deserving students in our area. This year, despite the school year being uprooted by COVID, we still received eight scholarship applications from local seniors graduating from Kearsarge Regional High School. Of those eight, the SKIT Scholarship Committee — chair, Michael T. Brown II, SKIT secretary Rachel Allen-Parsons and new SKIT member Elizabeth Forgiel — was pleased to award four scholarships.

Scholarship winners include Courtney Goodwin, who will be attending the University of New Hampshire in the fall; Erin Chouinard, attending Middlebury College; Emily Swindell, attending Smith College; and Patrick Seward, attending Syracuse University. Scholarships were awarded on Tuesday, June 30th, in a sociallydistanced ceremony with immediate family on the New London town green.
