

It is with great sadness and many, many fond memories that we share the news of Jack Tate's passing. Jack was one of our originals. A founding member of SKIT, Jack loved all aspects of theatre and lent his talents to many productions by performing, working behind the scenes, in front of house, and serving on the SKIT board.

From performing in the first two SKIT shows, *Yuletide Traditions* in 1993 and *A Christmas Memory* in 1994, up through helping with tickets and greeting patrons at the last show we did, Jack was involved in SKIT all along the way. He was a great storyteller with a real sense of humor and was always ready with a pun!



He was equally at home with musicals, melodramas, comedies, and dramas. One of the highlights of his SKIT career was portraying Samuel Potter in Donald Hall's *The Bone Ring*. He played Grandpa in *You Can't Take It with You* for the benefit of the Lake Sunapee Visiting Nurse Association. The success of that show gave Norman Leger the inspiration to start a charitable theater group that became SKIT.

He was a good friend and an invaluable member of the SKIT community.
