Looking Ahead

Please join us for our Spring show, *Puffs*, directed by Suzanna Brown at the Warner Town Hall, April 3-5, 2020.

Puffs, written by Matt Cox, takes place over the course of seven years at a school for teenagers who want to learn magic. There are good guys, bad guys... and ... Puffs. Despite being about a bunch of 11– to 17-year-olds this show is definitely not for children. It's a show written for actors who love to act, improvise and have fun and be pretty inappropriate at times. At its core it's about creating your own family and finding your place in the world. The show calls for 11 actors, only four of them are NOT playing multiple characters. Lines are improvised, actors are given more than one line option and it has enough quick changes to make your head spin!

Working with our partnering group, Kearsarge Food Hub, has been an amazing experience so far and I am so thrilled with how many "new" and "old" SKIT faces came out for auditions. So far, rehearsals have been a riot and we hope people come join us for the show April 3rd, 4th and 5th. — *Suzanna Brown*
